RULE CHANGE EFFECTIVE 1982

Effective January 1, 1982 all new members joining Chapter 67 will be required to pay the following:

1. \$15.00 Membership dues--payable immediately.
2. \$50.00 Hangar Fund--payable within 90 days.

The amounts remain unchanged from recent years. The change will require the new member to pay his/her hangar fund amount within 90 days. Hangar Fund balances remaining unpaid after the 90 days will be increased by \$1.00 for each month, or fraction thereof, that they remain unpaid. Balances remaining unpaid after 6 months will be referred to the Board of Directors for appropriate action.
