General Business

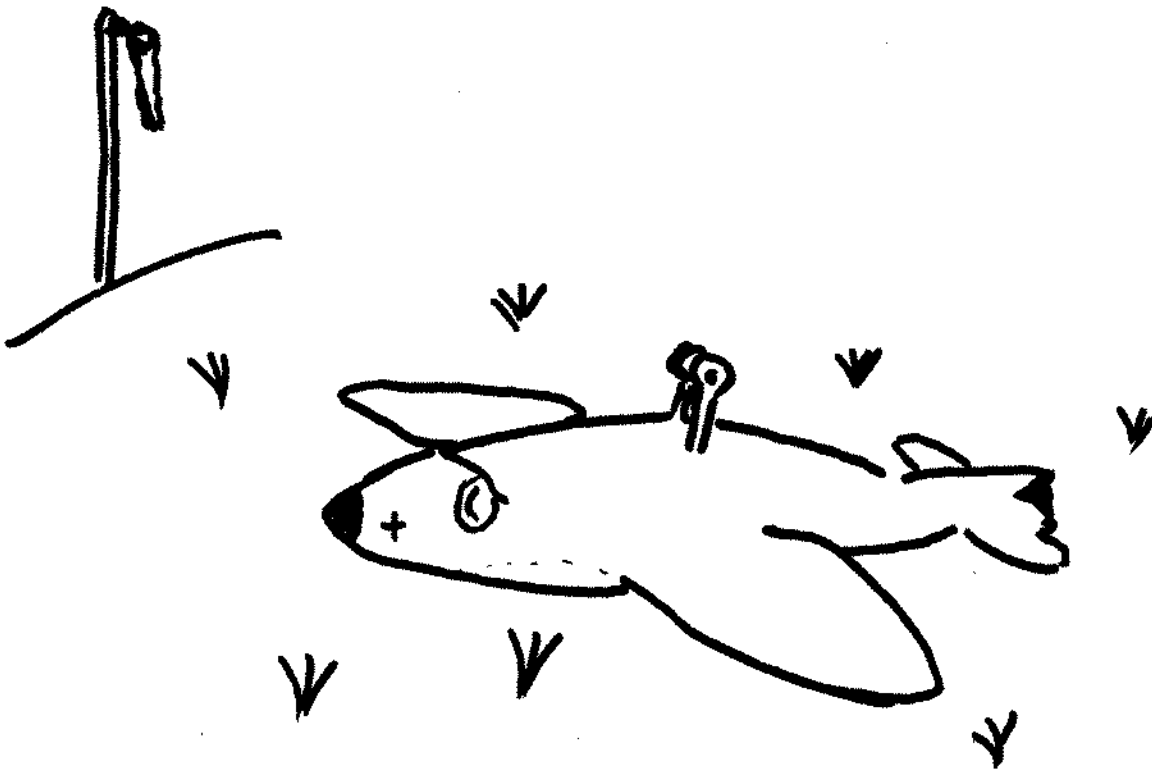
