Mauri Hobson has a 35amp generator, 6.00 wheels, Goodyear brakes, various aircraft parts and strob lights for sale.

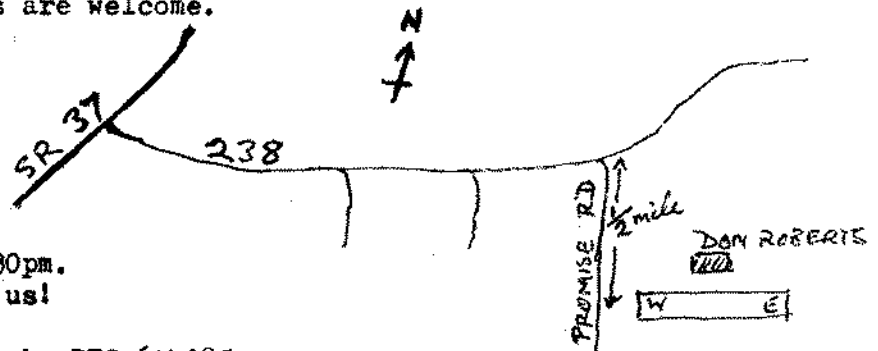
